

Two Week Summer Film Camp

This summer, become part of a film production crew while you learn from the experts all about what it takes to create a film, from the story board to the final edit. You'll get hands-on experience in script writing, camera operation, blocking, acting and music production by teaming up with professionals in the movie industry. You'll also get to attend a public premiere of your film.

Who can participate? This is an equal opportunity program, so YOU can, as long as you are a Middle or High School student between the ages of 13 and 18.

When and where do we meet? Monday through Saturday for the first week, and Monday through Friday the second week, after summer school, at the Weill Institute, 2100 Chester Avenue in Downtown Bakersfield, beginning at 1pm and ending at 7pm.

How much does it cost, and what does that get me? \$1350, with a \$250 non-refundable deposit due by March 1st. After March 1st, the cost of the camp goes up to \$1450. (Some scholarships are available.) The cost covers all materials, dinner and snacks, and a cool T-shirt!

Who are our instructors? The camp is led by veteran actor and film maker **Joey Travolta**. Joey travels across the country throughout the year holding film camps for young film makers of all backgrounds, experience levels and abilities. He hand-picks his teaching team based on both their years in the field, and their creativity when it comes to working with young people. To learn more about Joey's camps, go to www.joeytee.com.

Call the **Arts Council of Kern** at **661-324-9000** between the hours of 9am and 5pm, Tuesday through Friday, and they'll send you an application form. Or, you can go online at www.kernarts.org and download one. Or, you can stop by their office at **2000 K Street, Suite 110** and pick one up. Only 50 students will be selected. If you're one of the ones selected, **you'll need to make a deposit of \$250** in order for the Arts Council to know that you're really committed. There will be an orientation evening in late spring for all Summer 2008 campers and their families.
