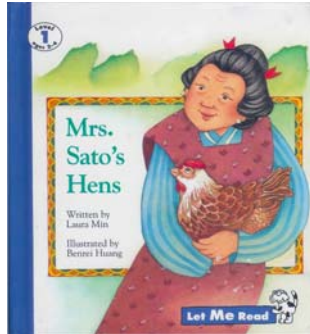


“Egg Calendar”

Activity used with Mrs. Sato’s Hens



In the book, “Ms. Sato’s Hens” a girl and her grandmother count a different amount of eggs each day of the week. In order to illustrate this for students, a week calendar was created.






Items needed for this activity:

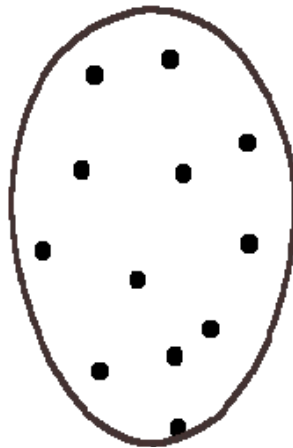
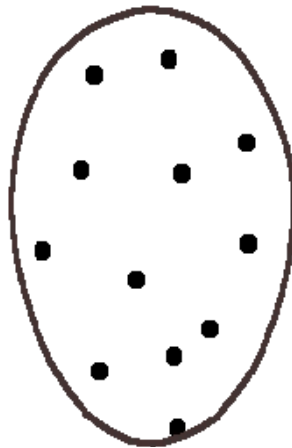
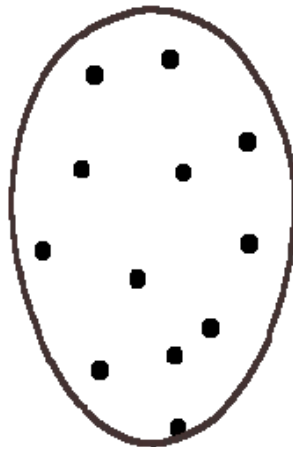
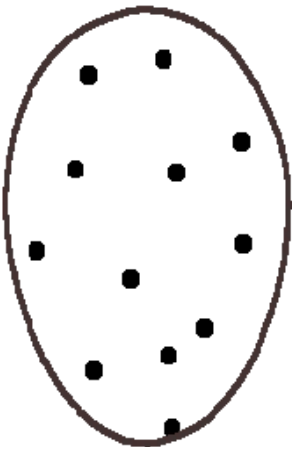
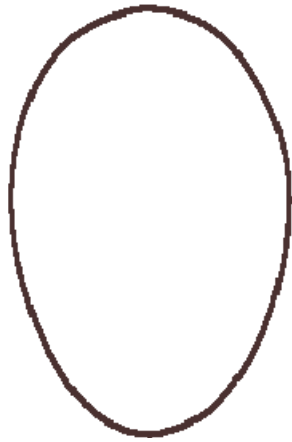
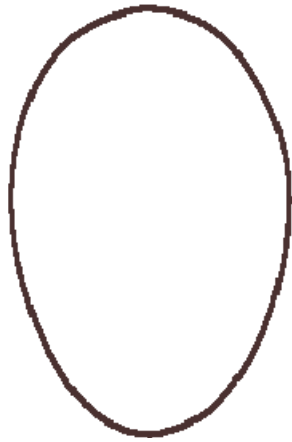
- 1 Sentence Strip
- 1 piece of cardstock
- Velcro
- 7 cups
- Egg Templates (Can be copied on cardstock and laminated. Use a brown color for Tuesday template)

Directions:

1. The sentence strip is used to place the days of the week in a straight line.
2. On the cardstock, write out the names of each day of the week. Each day is to be cut out individually and placed with Velcro to the sentence strip (note: by using Velcro, the order of the week days can be manipulated as needed).
3. Once the sentence strip displays the days of the week, the egg templates can be cut out individually. A child could place eggs into a cup or container underneath the corresponding day of the week as read in Ms. Sato’s hens. Remember: it is important to emphasize the concept of ZERO when “no eggs were found.”
