Meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m. by Administrator, Michael Hulsizer.

Michael Husizer stated that the purpose of this meeting today was to go over changes in the consolidated application and to answer any questions about it. Also to discuss if the consortium is meeting the needs of the school districts.

The first question discussed was regarding Part I of the consolidated application. and who would sign the application. It was stated that a school district representative must sign off on this page rather than Steve Hageman. Michael Hulsizer said that he would put a call in to Greg Wolf to find out for sure

It was brought up that the same person to sign below should not be the same as the contact person that is named above. If you are not a part of the consortium then agency representative would have to sign.

It was suggested that Steve Hageman sign all the consolidated applications and then obtain each district representatives' initials on the document, but it was decided that Steve could not go from district to district to obtain all the needed signatures.

It was discussed was that if you are part of a consortium then that consortium is your advisory committee as long as you have a representative in that committee.

There were complaints from several representatives that they receive conflicting information from that of Kern County Superintendent of Schools Office because they contact many different sources at the State Department. Michael Hulsizer suggested that the districts let Kern County Superintendent of Schools Office be the contact person for all the districts and that Greg Wolf at the State Department will be our continous contact person there.

The second item discussed was the Private School Section for Title 4. In the past this has been separate, but now it is the responsibility for each of the districts to call all of the private schools that have filed an affidavit with KCSOS if there are six students or more and ask them if they want to remain part of the consortium.

Steve Hageman will compile a survey form and he will follow up for you and negotiate with the private school for the service that they will be entitled to.

The third item discussed was Page 13, the Survey of Expulsions. The form says to identify every referral, but most keep only records of actual expulsions.

Out of 35 million to be distributed, 70% will be based on ADA; the other 30% or approximately 10 million will be distributed to the districts with the highest number of expulsions. So this form will be used to rate the districts. You may get extra money, but also may take heat for a having a high number of expulsions and a way of obtaining your money.

Two issues regarding this are 1) Don't want you to put referrals on suspensions; only want actual suspensions and 2) Some districts may attempt to put referrals under suspensions

If you are in the Kern County Substance Abuse Prevention Education Consortium and are selected to receive these monies then KCSAPE will have a separate program for you so that your district will receive extra services. You will have a separate program so that the extra monies that you received will go back into your district.

Page 1: Michael Hulsizer let everyone know to be sure that when checking the programs that you are applying for on the consolidated application that you also check the Title 4 if you are applying for your own consolidated application. Also check Eisenhower. Also be sure to mark Title I.

It was decided after all that the districts would not have to mark Title II, the Eisenhower.

Page 2: The preliminary plan is the section that most district representatives were concerned about and it was decided that Steve will put in the mail on Friday, May 5, 1995, a suggested response to the preliminary plan.

Steve will develop a list of activities for you to include in your application and when and who will carry out that activity. The focus is on planning so it will be more detailed.

Page 3: Regarding question 1, Educational goals refer to Title I and Steve will give you goals and some of these goals will also apply to SDFCA and Title I also. For every goal, there must be an explanation of how the goal has been met. Steve will provide the information for you to use.

Section E: Steve will give suggested 3-5 activities. These activities will fit under more than one section.

Several representatives asked for this information to be supplied on disk, but Steve said that time did not allow for us to do this.

Other business discussed:

Steve reminded everyone that MOU's are due May 18, 1995.

CCR is scheduled for CCR 1996-1997. State is being vague on what it will look like.

The mailing assurances are not available yet and will not be until July or August.

Additional revenues coming in on additional money from Tobacco. Steve will submit the application for the Tobacco monies. That will not change.

A question was asked what specifically did the TUPE money pay for and what specifically did the DATE money pay for.

Michael Hulsizer stated that all monies were used to fund prevention-based programs. No specific programs are funded by specific money. It is a comprehensive approach program. All programs include a tobacco prevention message in case of an audit.
